We hope the topic will be 'Revisiting the Debate on Eucharistic Sharing'. At the Society's residential weekend in May 2003 around the St Alban's Conference, there was a searching exploration of the questions surrounding eucharistic sharing and a possible task in engaging imaginatively in them by the Society's members. This was in the light of Pope John Paul's encyclical on the Eucharist, the forthcoming review of 'One Bread, One Body', issues about inter-communion within the Anglican Communion, and the insights gained from the key role played in the Association of InterChurch Families by active members of our own Society. I will circulate a fuller aide-memoire on our May discussion in the New Year mailing.
