It is available from InterChurch House, 35-41 Lower Marsh, London SE1 7RL, at the modest cost of £2.50. Three of our members were involved in the work. It represents a major achievement for Martin Reardon, who guided the rest of the group through the immensely complex task, not merely of analysing the views of twenty or so churches, but trying to find points of common ground from which we can all advance together. Martin carried this task out: with his usual tact, gentleness and clarity. The hope is that the churches, at every level, will discuss the report and its conclusions and suggestions. Knowing the very considerable interest in local ecumenism, as well as in the national scene amongst all our members, I hope everyone will have a role in this work, however expressed or carried out.

The Cambridge meeting, as aforementioned, is at Westminster College, on 27th April, llam to 4pm on the subject of 'United in Baptism?' Maximos Lavriotes and David Thompson from amongst our membership will give papers, as will Mrs Faith Bowers, a Baptist with extensive knowledge and experience in Faith and Order matters.
